<p>Name of activity</p> <p>Culture and Identity: Similarities and Differences</p>	<p>Year group</p> <p>2nd/3rd/4th years</p>
<p>Procedure</p> <p>To think about their own identity and being part of a group, students move in small groups to discuss:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The social groups they are involved in such as family, school, sports clubs, music clubs or ICT clubs 2. Each student highlights their most important group and students stand up when their 'group' is called out 3. Students discuss the meaning of social exclusion and togetherness and suggest ways in which they can be more inclusive <p>Students will develop a greater awareness of the things they have in common, as well as their differences.</p>
