Procedure

TY groups prepare a presentation on intercultural skills to deliver to all classes in the school. Students can use different forms of media, artwork or music to present.

Tolerance This is the ability to accept when things are not clear and to be able to deal positively with the situation.

Respect for others This is the ability to be curious and open to other cultures and to appreciate similarities and differences

to our own.

Adaptability This is the ability to adapt your behaviour depending on different situations.

EmpathyThis is the ability to understand what people think and how they feel in different situations.

Communication This is the ability to speak to people from other cultural backgrounds in a way in which they can

understand.

Discovery This is the ability to find out about a culture and their ways and to use this information to help you to

communicate.
