Procedure

Annual Initiative: Students and teachers drop everything and read on the annual 'drop everything and read' day. Books can be in any language and home language texts are encouraged.

Embedded in classroom practice: Teachers source subject-specific news articles and stories for the class to read for 'drop everything and read' weekly.

Annual initiative /embedded in classroom practice
