Procedure

To highlight some of the Global Goals for Sustainable Development Issues an inhouse or inter-school debate can be organised. The following are some suggestions:

- 1. Decide on a question to be debated such as, 'Is our country a soft touch for asylum?'
- 2. Students are assigned different roles to debate from that perspective such that of an asylum-seeker, politician, journalist, charity worker, etc.
- 3. Give students time to research their positions and prepare their arguments.
- 4. Organise a debate.
