Global Goals for Sustainable Development:History

Year group 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th Year

Procedure

To highlight the Global Goals for Sustainable Development Issues, the History department agrees to explore an issue with each year group.

- 1. Explore how history has affected students' personal identity, culture and lifestyle.
- 2. Investigate how history has been selectively interpreted to create stereotypical perceptions and to justify views and actions. This could be fake news, documenting sources, journalism and bias in writing/relaying events, decisions around what to include in school curriculum and textbooks relating to recent history, as well as the slant of the author relating to events.
- 3. Investigate the impact of significant events and ideas of the 20th century on the world.
- 4. Investigate critical issues in history or historical figures who have behaved ethically or unethically. Explore from a different perspective such as now vs. then and those living in the country vs. those outside.
- 5. Investigate modern day issues like Trump and immigration.
